



The Department for Education told the School Teachers' Review Body (STRB) a 2.8 per cent pay award "would be appropriate" for 2025-26, but that most schools would have to find efficiencies to fund it.

The union has estimated that the proposed unfunded pay award would lead to 76% of primary schools and 94% of secondary schools making cuts next year.
